## Women in Super Mother's Day Classic 2023

The Mother's Day Classic is now 26 years strong, annually running Australia's largest fun run and walk for breast cancer research. It's a yearly tradition for tens of thousands of Australians who come together every year to start their Mother's Day with purpose.

Over the past 26 years, the MDC event has grown from a walk in the park to an iconic, national event with up to 100 events across the country on Mother's Day.

Since 1998, over 1.6 million Australians have participated, donating \$44 million to fund lifesaving breast cancer research. Over this time, the 5 year survival for those diagnosed with breast cancer has risen from 84% to 92% - but there's still more to be done.

Tragically, the 5 year survival rate for a woman diagnosed with ovarian cancer is 49% and there is no early detection test. Every day in Australia nine women die from breast cancer, when you add ovarian cancer that number goes to 12 deaths every day. One death is too many.

That's why in 2024, we're going further and inviting our participants to walk or run in support of ovarian cancer research, in addition to breast cancer research.

Together we can accelerate progress towards a day where every woman diagnosed with either breast or ovarian cancer will be given the assurance that they can survive.

### Message from the Chair

#### 2023 marked the 26th running of the Women in Super Mother's Day Classic.

On Sunday 14 May 2023, over 65,000 participants and almost 1,000 volunteers gathered in celebration around the country. They walked, ran, cheered, and got active for breast cancer research.

The Mother's Day Classic (MDC) wrapped its arms around our country from the far north corner of Western Australia in Karratha down to Hobart in Tasmania, from Roma across to Alice Springs, and each of the 72 locations in between. On behalf of the Board, I acknowledge the extraordinary work of our National Advisory Committee, each of the state and territory organising committee members, and our local event hosts and their teams, who all generously volunteer their time to make these events happen. In 2023, we are thrilled to donate \$2.55 million to the National Breast Cancer Foundation, bringing our total donation to \$44 million since 1998.

It was a great honour to be appointed Chair of the Mother's Day Classic Foundation (MDCF) Board in October 2022. As a passionate and active member of the superannuation industry, I have also been an enthusiastic supporter of both Women in Super and the Mother's Day Classic for many years, becoming an MDC Fundraising Champion in 2016.

Stepping into the role of Chair and continuing the legacy of Mavis Robertson and Louise Davidson, I recognise I have very big shoes to fill.

Louise Davidson, who stepped down as Chair of MDCF in October 2022 and finished her tenure as a director in August 2023, has played an integral role in the founding and growth of the MDC, transforming the event into the muchloved, iconic Australian event it is today.

We are immensely grateful for Louise's dedication and while we say thank you, we do not say goodbye as she will always be integral to the MDC community.

As a way of honouring Louise's legacy as the co-founder, as a volunteer, a director and Chair of the organisation across the last 26 years, in October 2023 we awarded the inaugural Louise Davidson Local Host Development Award.

Thousands of volunteers, hosts and committee members have served the MDC and as Louise's dear friend and former WIS Chair and former MDCF director, Cate Wood so aptly put it, they have "developed new skills, networked, met mentors, found purpose and been rewarded and humbled by everyone touched by breast cancer". We want to acknowledge this contribution and facilitate further professional development in Louise's honour. This award, which will be awarded annually at the Celebration Function will recognise Local hosts that have demonstrated exceptional commitment, dedication and service to their local and/or and the broader, MDC community.

Award recipients will be be granted an amount up to \$1,500 (including GST) to fund professional development opportunities to develop and strengthen specialist skills necessary to their role as Local Hosts.

In 2023, the inaugural Louise Davidson Local Host Development Award was awarded to Carman Abi-Saab. Carmen is the current Local Events Representative on the National Advisory Committee having served in that role for the last 3 years and is also co-host of the iconic Port Macquarie Local event in NSW for the last 9 years. We thank Carmen for her passionate and tireless support of the MDC over so many years.

An exciting new era begins in 2024, as the Mother's Day Classic wraps its arms around more women, extending its impact to include both breast cancer research and ovarian cancer research. I hope you will join us on Sunday 12 May 2024 as we come together as a community to walk, run and unite to raise awareness and funds that will help put a stop to breast and ovarian cancers.

## Message from the CEO

#### ZARA LAWLESS



#### The Women in Super Mother's Day Classic community never ceases to amaze and delight.

In a year of challenges and uncertainty for so many, and on the back of devasting natural disasters that impacted almost all of our local event communities, the MDC movement once again stood stronger together. Participation was up 30% across Australia and our community delivered the highest donation to the National Breast Cancer Foundation since 2017.

The MDC Community is and should be incredibly proud of the impact it has had since the event began as a humble walk in the park in 1998:

- 1.6 million participants;
- \$44 million donated to the National Breast Cancer Foundation; and
- 81 research projects funded.
- As an organisation over the last year, we have

been on a journey to reflect where we have been over the last 25 years and consider the impact we want to continue having for the next 25 years. One of the important sentiments that came out of this undertaking was the importance of activism. In 1998, Louise Davidson, Mavis Robertson, and the entire Women in Super network saw that far too many women were dying from breast cancer and believed that by "getting active" and funding research, as a collective, we could do something about it.

That sentiment of coming together as a community and getting moving, until the job is done remains at the heart of the MDC. With the relative five-year survival rate at 92%, the job is not done when it comes to breast cancer research. The Mother's Day Classic Foundation remains committed to partnering with the National Breast Cancer Foundation to achieve the goal of Zero Deaths from breast cancer. However, in 2024 we want to go even further.

The relative five-year survival rate for a woman diagnosed with ovarian cancer is just 49%. Treatment approaches have barely changed since the Mother's Day Classic began 26 years ago and there remains no early detection test. Just as our founders said "not good enough" in 1998 so we say "not good enough" today.

That's why in 2024 we've giving our participants the opportunity to participate and fundraise in support of breast cancer research, ovarian cancer research or both. We warmly welcome the Ovarian Cancer Research Foundation to the MDC community, who along with the National Breast Cancer Foundation, will be the beneficiaries of the proceeds of the 2024 Mother's Day Classic.

Another person who never ceases to amaze is our co-founder and now former MDCF Chair, Louise Davidson. We thank Louise for her dedication and commitment over the last 26 years, and for inspiring so many of us to be part of this incredible movement.

The MDC movement is made up of so many dedicated event hosts, community ambassadors, volunteers, partners, committee members, sponsors, fundraisers and supporters and we can't thank you all enough for being part of it. The success and impact of the MDC belongs to every one of you.

Thank you to our dedicated Board, who all give so much and, through their guidance and wisdom, ensure that the MDC is set for a very bright future.

Thank you to the small yet talented MDCF team for the passion, creativity and purpose they show up with every day to bring the MDC to life.


